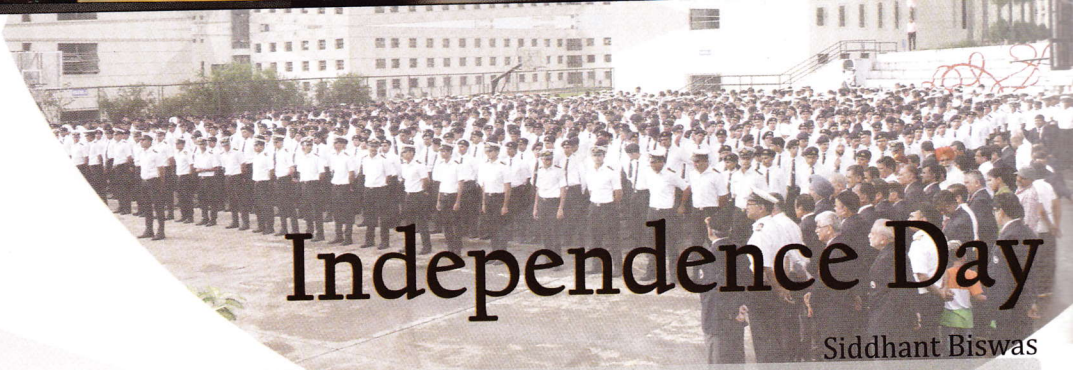

Replacement of Water Tube Boiler

Attitude, Skill, Knowledge- This very motto is what sets the cadets of Tolani Maritime Institute apart from students of other institutes. It has always been of utmost importance for the college to keep its cadets at the fore-front of all new and emerging technologies in the marine field and for this purpose the Institute has laboratories in numerous disciplines, which provide in-depth knowledge to its cadets. Keeping this in mind the institute has added to its vast collection of machines, a new Boiler. Scientifically known as 'AQ5 Composite System Vertical Water Tube Boiler', this machine is one of a kind and something that only a handful of other colleges can boast of.

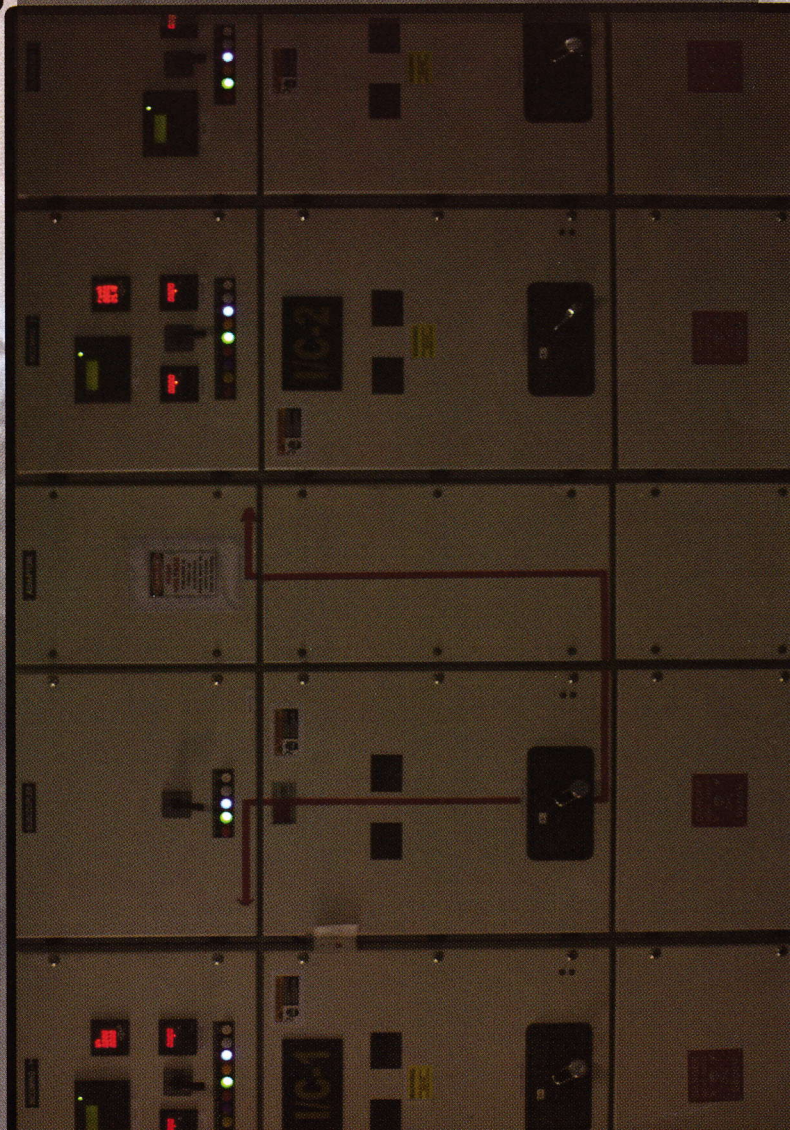
This magnificent beast which runs on Heavy-duty Diesel oil has a gross water holding capacity of 5.5 m³ and an evaporation rate of 1200 kg/hr. The main objective of this machine is to provide the cadets of Second Year, Marine Engineering, hands-on experience which will aid them in having a better understanding of a boiler. The cadets will be able to explore, probe and experiment with different components of the machine which will enable them to visualize its operation. The installation of this machine which will take a few months will have active participation of the cadets. The faculty team in-charge plans to involve the cadets in building add-on features like sensors and LED signals which will add to the learning experience.

High Voltage Lab

Our college constantly proves its mettle among the top maritime institutes in the country with a state-of-the-art workshop which has top-notch equipment for the training of world-class engineers and officers. One of the labs present in our workshop is the High Voltage Lab.

Managed by Mr. L. S. Tikore this lab offers an in depth glance into the world of maritime electronics. The lab is loaded with high performance equipment which are used for the training of future and current marine engineers alike. High Voltage Panel (with vacuum circuit breaker), Low Voltage Panel (with air circuit breaker), IR/PI meters, High Voltage detector, Discharging trolley and Earth tester are some of the equipment present in the lab. Our college, with its high standards regarding safety, also provides the trainees with personal protective equipment such as hard gloves, safety shoes, and arc suits. Chief Engineers and Second Engineers from various international companies have come to this lab to complete a 5-day course that has been approved by the Director General of Shipping, India. The fourth year cadets are also required to perform a one day course offered by the lab as per the orders of the Director General of Shipping, India.




Horizon 2K19

At the end of the second day, TMI stood 2nd on the points table, falling short to Anglo Eastern by 1 point.

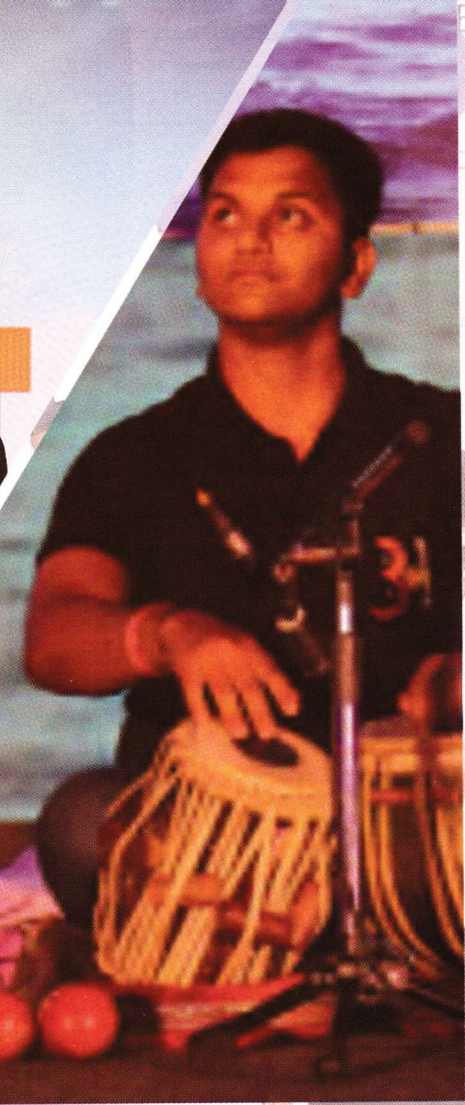
With possibilities of a new college being crowned as the overall champion at the end of the first day, the fierce cadets of our college stepped up to the occasion and brought laurels for the institution.

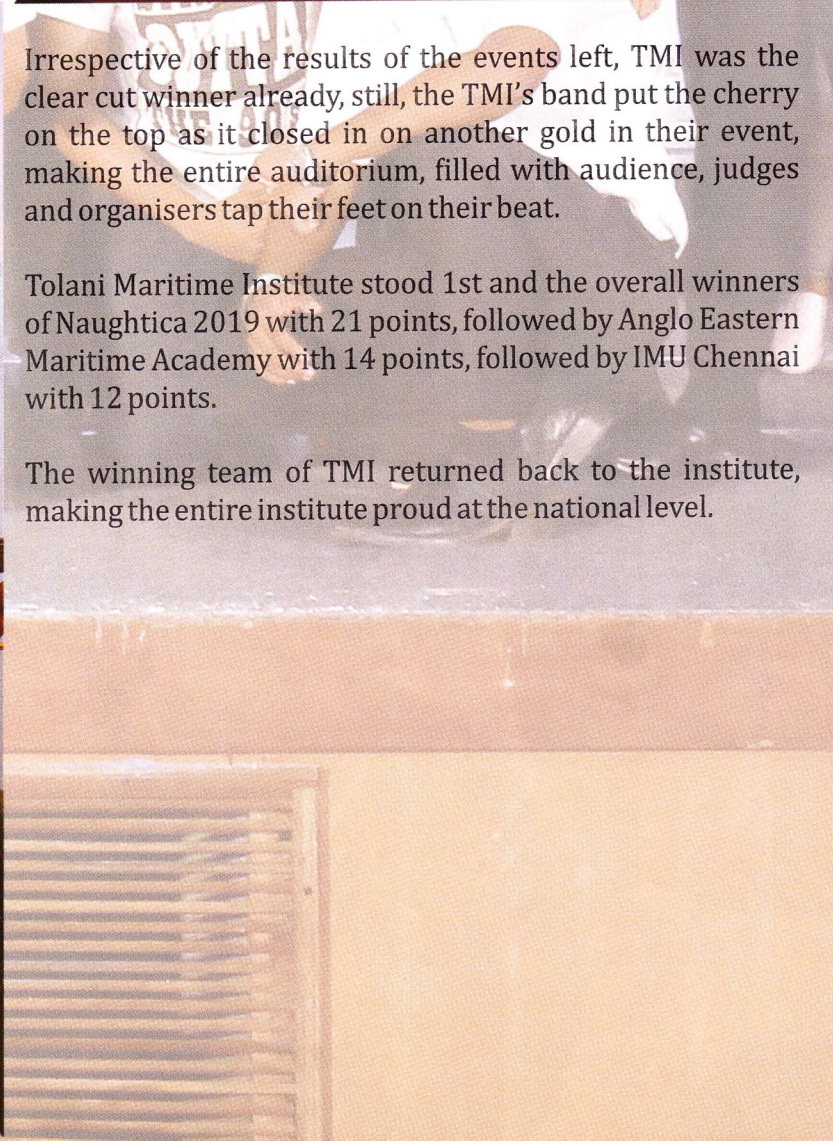
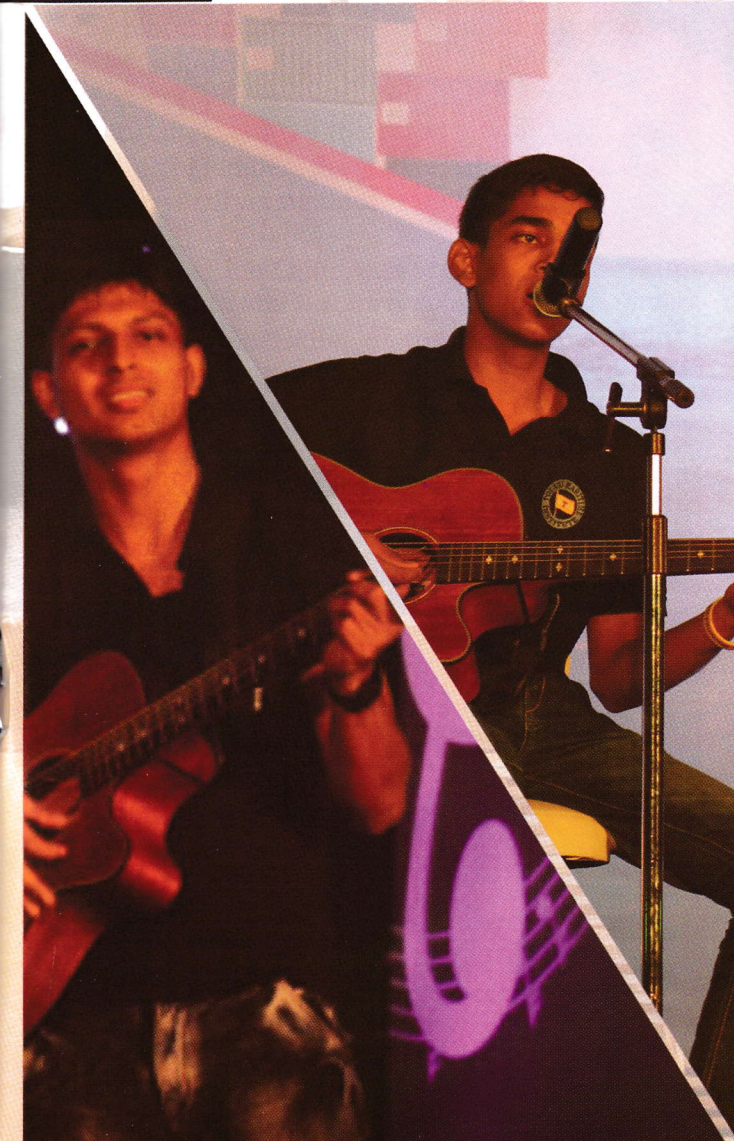

It is a belief at Tolani Maritime Institute, "The world is waiting to be a better place. All it needs is effort from you." You are the change the world needs to make it a better place.

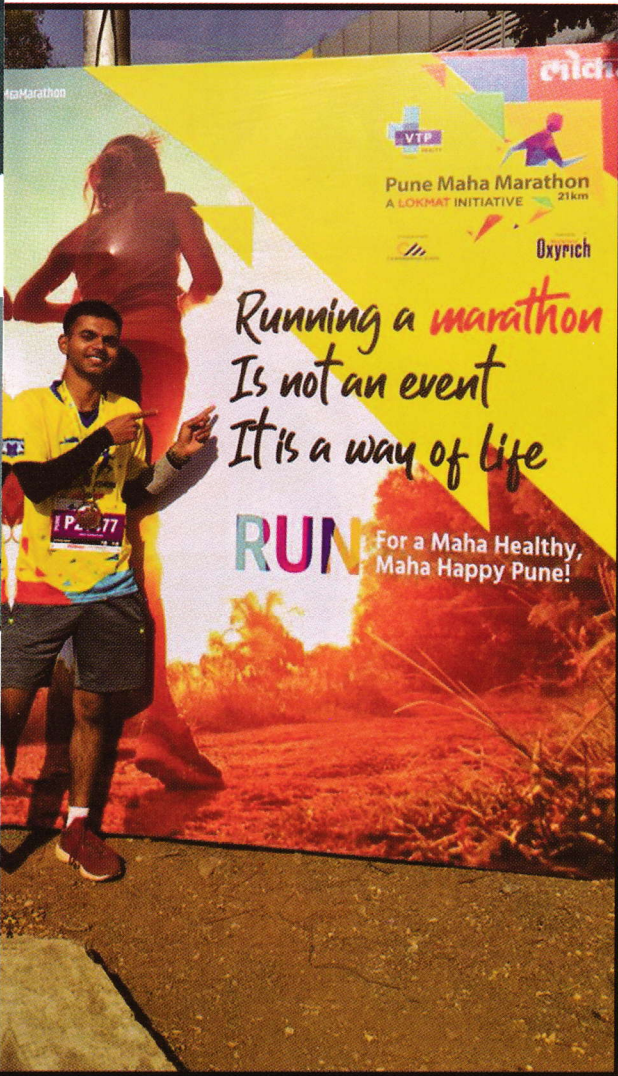




Pune Marathon

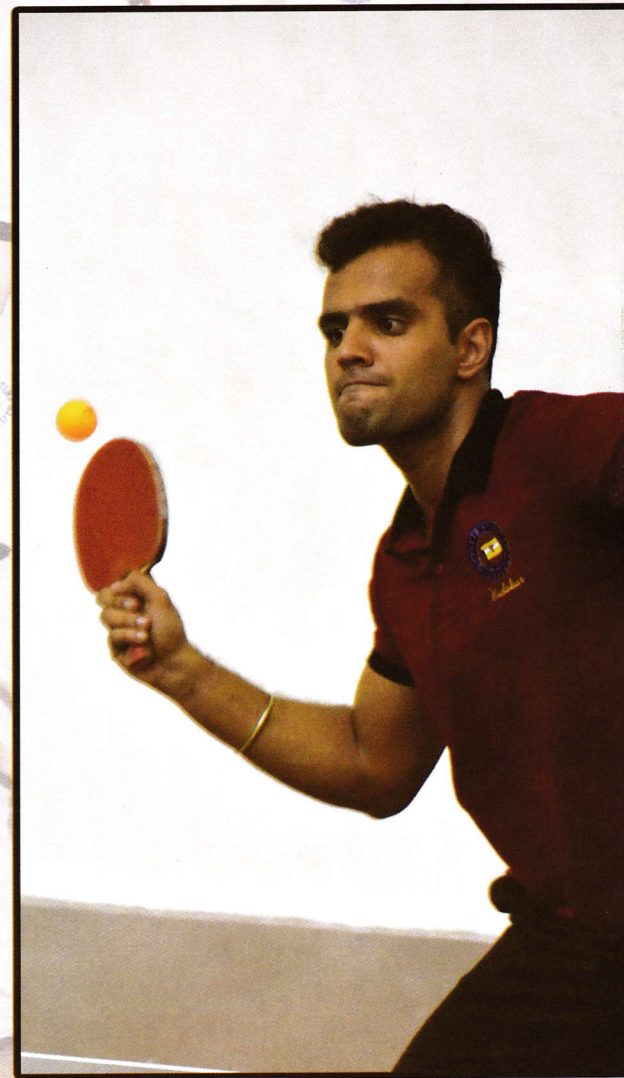
