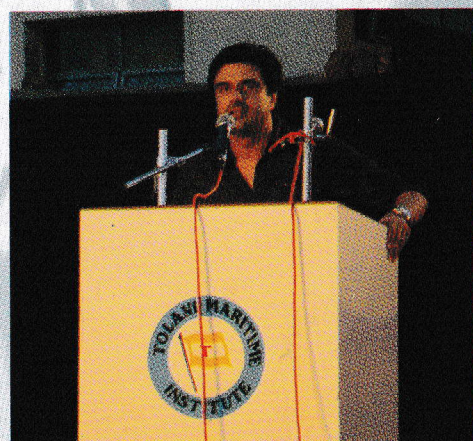
Mettle '09

Transtech '09: Fusion of Minds

Transtech'09 deliberating 'Recent Trends in Transportation Sector' concluded at Tolani Maritime Institute on 21st March, 2009. It was a marathon event with over 100 students participating from 16 marine and other engineering colleges from across the country and presenting papers on various issues pertaining to the above theme. A variety of topics like ship design, propulsion, alternative fuels, IC Engines, Materials, etc. were spoken about during the three day conference.

The event started with a video filmed by cadets and opening remarks by Mr. S.K. Srivastava, Organizing Secretary of the event. Prof. B.K. Saxena, Principal, TMI, iterated TRANSTECH'09 to be a learning as well as friendship making opportunity for the cadets. Prof. I.K. Basu, Programme Chair, Marine Engineering, TMI, was the Convener of the event.

Mr. Ganapathy Varadharaj, Country Manager (India and Sri Lanka), Lloyd's Register Asia, Mumbai, was the Chief Guest for the occasion. He deliberated on burning issues for the global maritime sector with special reference to climate change. He discussed various energy saving techniques for the shipping sector. As advocated by the Inter-Governmental Panel for Climate Change (IPCC), Clean Development Mechanism is

going to be part of global maritime sector and a new business opportunity.

Prof. P.K. Mishra, Professor, Emeritus of College of Engineering, Pune and formerly Professor at IIT, Kharagpur, enlightened the audience with laser machining techniques. He presented papers on multi functional laser machine for the benefit of manufacturing sector. The maritime sector is in much need of such innovations and confluence of technologies. The talk by Mr. Kiran Patil, Senior Executive, Crompton Greaves Ltd., Nasik, presented the latest developments in medium voltage switchgears with case studies.

Prof. V.S. Raja, Professor, IIT, Mumbai, explained the basics of corrosion and presented the 5M model for corrosion mitigation for ships.

Prof. S.C. Misra, Director, Indian Maritime University(IMU), Vishakhapatnam, presented his invited talk on Hull Propeller Interaction. He explained the fluid dynamics of a ship structure and lucidly presented the flow modeling of a back propeller ship.

Capt. Dinesh Gautama, G.M., Sea Consortium, presented the latest overview of the global shipping industry and its commercial aspects with latest statistics.

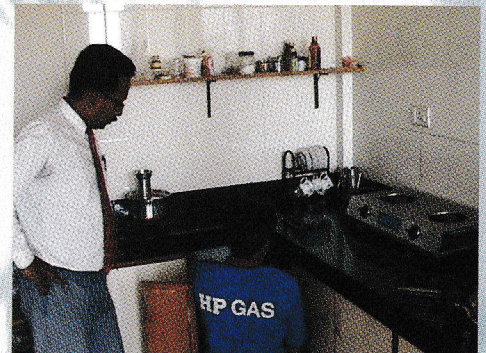

A speech on health and safety was given by Dr. Tonsing Samuel while Mr. Richard Montero discussed about road safety.

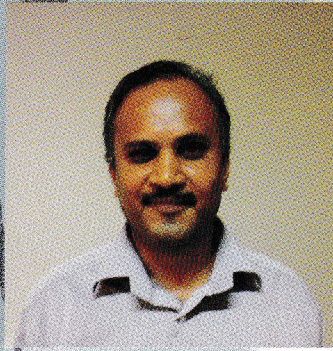
The programme concluded with an informative safety movie in the auditorium, thus ending a very well planned and successful 'National Safety Week' in Tolani Maritime Institute.

Profile



Mr. Praveen Kumar Vaidya has been working as Librarian in TMI since three years. He finished his Masters degree in Library and Information Science (MLISc) from Karnataka University, Dharwad, in 1997 with 'first rank gold medal'. In the same year, he was qualified with all India National Eligibility Test (NET) conducted by the University Grants Commission (UGC). He started his career as Library Assistant at Indira Gandhi Institute of Development Research (IGIDR) Goregaon, Mumbai. Later, he joined as a Librarian at Narsee Monjee College of Commerce and Economics, Juhu, Mumbai, where he initiated and completed Automation of Library activities. At TMI, he took up a project, 'Vidyanidhi', an effort to provide the catalogue details of the LRC's (Learning Resource Center) collection of over 10,000 books and reference aids to the cadets through 'Prabhugyan' (Institute's internal information server). He has attended national level seminars including Special Library Association, USA, held at New Delhi. His research interests are Web Information Retrieval, Digital Libraries and Semantic Web. One of his articles, 'Significance of Semantic Web in Digital Information Retrieval', was selected for a presentation in CALIBER 2009, conducted by INFLIBNET (Information and Library Network), Ahmedabad, held at Pondicherry in January '09. Mr. Vaidya is one of the few librarians selected from India and around the world for seeking feedback and user interface by Elsevier, the publisher of Science Direct and Engineering Village.

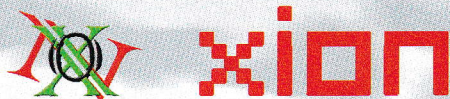

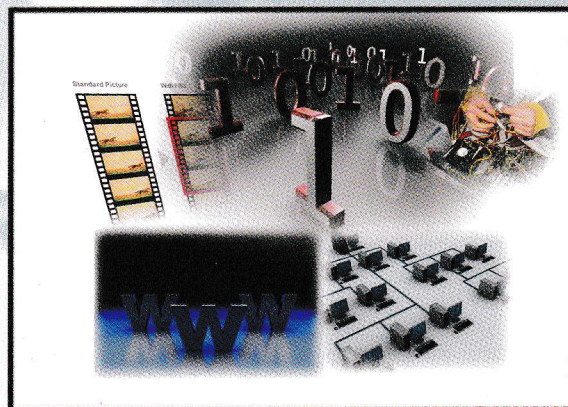

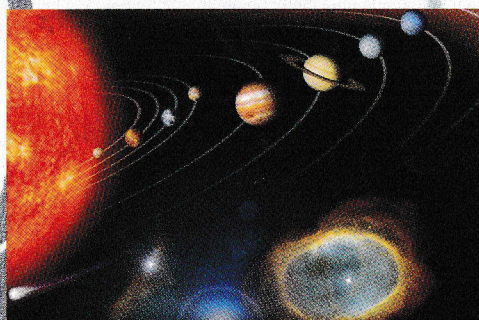
It plans to expand in the field of:

Mitra Mandal'. We hope this club, comprising cadets from all the years, continues to foster innovative thought and plausible solutions to universal mysteries.

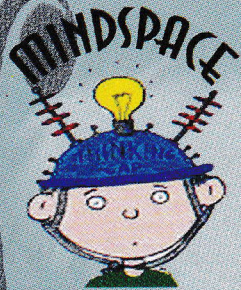
Xpressions 2K9
